A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY FOR YOU:

The creator of Black History Month was historian **Carter G. Woodson**. Often referred to as the "Father of Black History", he started the first Negro History Week in 1926 to ensure students would learn Black history. It grew into Black History Month starting in 1976.





Willie O'Ree will always be remembered as the National Hockey League's first Black player, and he continues to fight for more diversity in the sport. Educator and abolitionist

Lucy Stanton was the first Black woman to graduate from college. She completed a ladies' literary program and graduated from Oberlin College in 1850. Her commencement speech was an appeal for anti-slavery.





After becoming the very first African American and the first woman to graduate with a master's degree from the University of Hawaii, **Alice Ball** went on to invent the first successful treatment for Hansen's disease (otherwise known as leprosy) in 1916. It wasn't until years after her tragic death at the young age of 24 that Ball even got proper credit for her work.

Ethel Waters became the first Black performer to appear on TV after her one-night variety special, *The Ethel Waters Show*, which was aired on NBC in 1939.
