#### **Numismatic Exhibition**

The National Museum of Kenya is the flagship cultural destination of Nairobi for a reason... it has the good stuff! Nestled in the heart of the city, one component that Africa Soft Power delegates may find particularly relevant is the Numismatic Exhibition, which charts the history of banking and the application of digital technology in finance and trade. #### **Karen Blixen Home & Hills**

Just a short drive out into the suburbs from the city centre, you'll find the beautiful farmhouse where Karen Blixen, author of Out of Africa, lived between 1914 and 1931. The setting provides a fantastic insight into a unique voice from a bygone age, including museum dedicated to the author, and plenty of space for personal reflection along a nature trail set against the backdrop of Karen's beloved Ngong Hills. ### Flower Farms of Naivasha

For those looking to head a little further out without sliding into full holiday mode, the flower farms of Lake Naivasha are just 90km away, with a guided tour on offer.
